Presidents Report 2022

On behalf of the board of South Western Golf Association Incorporated I present the 2022 Presidents Report for your review and consideration.

I would like to acknowledge our current Life Members, Joye Burton, Reg Pearce and Mandy Buckley.

The game of golf has thrived through the pandemic as many new golfers realize the benefits of golf beyond the enjoyment of participating in a sport for all ages, gender, and abilities. Golf not only brings entertainment but has huge benefits in social, physical, and mental wellbeing. It is important that the district and their member clubs look ahead to ensure a strong and sustainable future for the next generation.

With the restrictions of COVID now behind us, the district and clubs have had a busy year. But, recent weather events have taken yet another toll on many clubs and their courses.

The SWGA Board would like to thank all member clubs and their members for their support in hosting District events in times where hosting incurs costs to the clubs giving up their courses and an inconvenience to their members not being able to play.

This has certainly been a discussion point at our board meetings, and we believe that moving forward there should be some financial compensation to hosting clubs whether they be big or small, in the form of a green fee component or financial support for costs incurred by volunteer based clubs. We all are aware of increasing costs associated with event management.

We continued our club visits this year and were able to build relationships and improve communication channels. Listening to the member clubs about issues, whether they be district or Golf Australia related was a common question. Where do their affiliation fees go and what do they get for them. Insurance and Golf Link management are a major component of GA fees along with club and facility support through national junior golf program, national strategy to increase female participation and engagement in golf at all levels, inclusion and diversity and much more. District fees cover costs of district championships, senior and junior pennant (finals and other costs), junior and senior male and female country week, women's clinic, Barwon Sports Academy (junior development) and some former GDGA events that do not charge an entry fee and therefore run at a loss.

Due to 2 years of COVID with no events, SWGA has been left with a reasonably healthy bank balance after expenses. We are proposing increased financial support for clubs hosting events, grant funding for clubs with innovative ideas i.e., bringing new groups into golf or who are financially disadvantaged (unable to fund equipment etc.) The grant funding would assist clubs complete, start, or develop programs that will assist areas of cashflow, clubhouse facilities and their golf courses. It would be by application and based on broad

criteria of innovation, inclusion, gender equality, junior development, mandatory or critical works with an inability to fund. To do this we propose to increase District affiliation fees to \$4.50 per club member. This would be the first increase since the merger of GDGA and SWDLGA in 2017.

SWGA would offset the additional affiliation fees by subsidizing member club costs in hosting events and grant funding.

A reduced entry fee for District events we hope would encourage increased participation. Events such as Mens Foursomes, Jack Donaldson, District Championships and Presidents Cup would become more attractive for players.

SWGA would form a working party with member club representation to implement the proposal.

If this proposal goes forward and is successful there would likely need to be a further affiliation fee increase in the following year as SWGA is proposing to subsidize the first year with funds accrued.

The district membership remains healthy and continues to grow. Please see attached figures. Total growth of 10.3% over the past 12 months indicates that the increased interest in golf post COVID gives both District and Member clubs the opportunity to grow the game at all levels.

Our Sporting Clubs Grant from 2021 allowed SWGA to enter into an agreement with Virtual Bean and the new website was launched in June this year. This new website allows maximum exposure of all District and member club events. Direct link to Golf Box enhances the ease of event information from registration, draws to results.

2022 has seen a new face in the district in Jake Cole-Sinclair who has assumed the Golf Australia role of Golf Relations Officer for our district along with Western and Ballarat Districts. His role is to encourage people to play golf, developing pathways for adults, women, and juniors with member clubs. I thank Jake for his support and the enthusiasm he has given this role.

Chris Crabbe has assumed the Senior role of Relationship Officer for Golf Australia and covers half of Victoria. Chris is still very much involved with our District, and I thank him for his support and contribution to all facets of District golf.

Our partnership with Geelong Community Foundation has been cemented with the commitment that SWGA will continue to raise much needed funds for their work in our community. Although our week of golf did not eventuate due to various reasons, we were able to raise \$3000 through our President Cup event at Curlewis in August.

The "R&A Women in Golf Charter" enables more women and girls to maximize their potential at all levels of the sport. We congratulate Barwon Valley, Curlewis, and Lonsdale links for publicly stating their commitment. By signing the charter these clubs will commit to supporting measures to increase the number of women, girls and families playing golf and recognize the inclusion of gender balance at every level of club management.

GA and SWGA created a joint sponsorship with Community Radio Pulse FM. Here we can tell the story of golf in our district. Each week Pulse legends Keith Almond and Tim Carr interview a representative from our member clubs. So far, we have had over 30 interviews. Topics range from who is SWGA, changes to golf courses, junior development, women's clinics at various clubs, all abilities golfing, golf tips from pros, course play, and event promotion.

As we move into 2023 our board will face some change. Graeme Mathers who has brought much experience and golfing knowledge to his role of Men's Golf Operations

chair is retiring and will not seek re-election. Angela Foott, board member has been of huge support in all areas of SWGA work especially to Women's Golf Operations. She will retire and not seek re-election. Cameron Place has been in the Treasurers Role for the past 3 years. He has brought a better understanding to all board members of the importance of accurate financial data. He is also retiring for family reasons. I want to thank Graeme, Angela, and Cam for their contribution to the Association and their support for my role as President.

Wendy Tottenham our Women's Golf Operations and her subcommittee of Fiona Scott, Bec Bain, Vicki Hannah and Ange Foott have had a very busy year being the first full year of events since COVID restrictions were lifted. The two women forums were invaluable to share district news, suggested event changes, conditions and new ideas of event management. Wendy's leadership and extensive golfing experience will ensure women's golf will move into the future alongside Golf Australia's Strategic Plan.

I thank her for her invaluable support in my two years.

Cameron Bowers assumed the role of Junior Coordinator this year. His passion and enthusiasm for junior golf and development is evident by the increase in junior participation in all events. Cam has great ideas on how to develop both boys and girls in their golf with the hope they continue with the sport into their adulthood. I thank Bernie Perry, our secretary for his ongoing commitment to the Association.

David Smith our Vice President will step into the Presidents role in 2023. His extensive experience in governance, golf and all matters associated with the district will bring much to all member clubs and their members.

Stacey Thomas our media promotions officer has faced some challenges with our old website and communication channels. With the help of Vicki Carney, she has fully supported the new website development and has ensured our Facebook social media portal is an up-to-date reference for all golfers.

As the constitution states in Rule 49 (4) and Rule 51 (2) the President and Vice President holds position for maximum of 2 years with rotation of gender after two years. I have enjoyed this period of my golfing life and feel confident that golf will continue to grow and evolve. It is a sport for life, but we must address the challenges and competition that faces us with open eyes and ensure new developments and strategies are tried and implemented.

The Golf Ops team of Wendy Tottenham, Angela Foott, Fiona Scott, Vicki Hannah & Bec Bain were ably supported by Georgie Sanders, & Stacey Thomas in their duties this year.

District Women's Forums continued to be an excellent platform for the Ops team to report district news, introduce new conditions, explain changes & elicit ideas from Clubland. Some changes introduced in 2022 include: - The 2022 SWGA Schedule of Events was bolstered by the staging of Otway Shield Day held at Apollo Bay for those players on G.A.s above 25 from clubs associated of Otway Pennant. - The Betty Kernot 4, day knock-out series was condensed to 1 team per club for a 16, team draw. - 7 players a side in division 1 Pennant - Introduction of a hybrid scratch/ handicap pennant division - Combining Leigh & Otway Divisions into one division as part of the Friday Pennant season. As a result of the feedback received post Pennant, Divisions will be recalibrated via aggregates to avoid 2 teams from the same club being in the same division, host teams not playing where possible & all divisions starting and finishing on the same day.

Independent Auditors Report

Scope

I have audited the attached financial statements, being a special purpose financial report comprising the Income and Expenditure Statement and Balance Sheet of the South Western Golf Association Incorporated for the period 1/7/21 to 30/6/22.

The association is responsible for the preparation and presentation of the financial reports and the information contained therein, and they have determined that the accounting policies used are consistent with the requirements of the association's constitution and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

I have conducted an independent audit of these financial reports in order to express an opinion on them to the members of the South Western Golf Association Incorporated, on the preparation and presentation thereof. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used are appropriate to the needs of the members.

The financial reports have been prepared for the distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements of the association's constitution. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility, for any reliance on this report or the financial report prepared as a special purpose financial report to which it relates, to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than which it was prepared.

My audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards to provide reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. My procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial statements, and the evaluation of accounting policies and significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly.

Qualification

As is common for organizations of this type, it is possible that errors or irregularities may occur in the internal control structure and not be detected. No such errors were detected in the sample transactions used.
